*Sharing Chagall: A Memoir – For Artists and Non-Artists Alike!*

The artist Marc Chagall is regarded as a pioneer of modernism and one of the greatest figurative artists of his century. For 11 years, Vivian Jacobson worked on his behalf on a variety of ventures. From her recollections of the time spent with Chagall, and from her study, research and a vast collection of documents, memorabilia and photographs, Vivian Jacobson created a dozen lectures touching on many aspects of Chagall's life. Out of the wealth of information she has gathered and conveyed to her audiences, came the writing of *Sharing Chagall: A Memoir*, in which she shares with her readers the essence of Chagall, the man. He inspired her with his message of Hope, Peace, Reconciliation and Love.

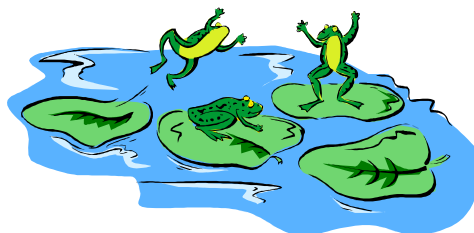
